

Ready, Respectful, Safe and Kind

During this week, we have been introducing our children and staff to the new simplified school rules. 'Ready, Respectful, Safe and Kind' will be the four clear statements which we will all work within.

When there are so many people interacting with children, it is important that we all have the same expectations and that we are consistent in our approach. As a large primary school, we want all our children and staff, from Nursery through to Year 6, to have a shared understanding of our expectations.



Ready: Ready for learning, ready to listen, ready to contribute towards our school and local community.

Respectful: Showing respect to our peers, to adults, to our environment, and to ourselves.

Safe: Safe in our learning environment, safe with the people around us and safe in the activities in which we are taking part.

Kind: Showing kindness in different ways — both big and small — showing care, concern, and consideration for ourselves and those with whom we share the world.

We are sure that these may also be very helpful at home too. You might already be considering the occasions when it may be very useful to use these rules!

As we journey through the school year, the children will have many opportunities to consider what it means to be 'Ready, Respectful, Safe and Kind'. These four rules will become the golden thread through our school, promoting exemplary behaviour, which is at the heart of productive learning.

School and Nursery Admissions

You should apply now, online at: www.eadmissions.org.uk for a Reception place in September 2020 if your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016. The closing date is 15th January 2020. Next week we will be publishing dates of our open mornings for prospective parents.

We have vacancies in our Nursery for September (3 hrs per day) if your child's date of birth is between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016, please contact the school office for further information.

School Meals

Children from Year 1 through to Year 6 have been enjoying the hot lunches, served in partnership with Chartwells. It has been especially exciting to see lunches being served in the upper school hall for the first time.

Thank you so much for your patience and understanding as we have moved to some new systems for meal ordering. We hope that the following notes are useful to you.



Ordering through ParentPay

All meals should be pre-ordered through ParentPay. When you log into ParentPay you will have the option of making your child's meal choices for each day. Each morning we print a report of the meal choices to ensure the correct numbers of meals are prepared. If you have not ordered a meal, we ask that you send your child to school with a packed lunch. If you need any support with ParentPay, please do speak to our office staff who will be happy to help.

Allergies and Special Diets

There is always a vegetarian option available to choose each day. If your child requires a special diet or has allergies, then please complete a form for Chartwells. We will then be able to work alongside the caterers to ensure that an appropriate meal is available. We are hoping that these will soon be able to be ordered through ParentPay for those parents who have indicated that their child has this requirement. In the meantime, we are also checking each day to ensure that each child has a meal which is safe for them. Please accept our apologies if this area of our meal provision has been confusing at the beginning of term, and has caused anxiety. We are working hard to ensure that this process is simpler and clearer going forward.

Parents of Reception Children

Reception parents will receive an 'activation letter' for Parent Pay at the beginning of next week so that you can order meals for the end of the week.


An Extraordinary School Year Ahead...

In School, On Time, Every Day

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a child's academic success, starting in Nursery and continuing through secondary school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in a job.

We really want to inspire our children and families to have an excellent pattern of attendance and punctuality. We would expect attendance to be at least 96% across the school, with children turning up on time every day.
