Elections and Polling Stations

I am sure you won't have missed the big news that there is due to be a General Election on Thursday 12 December.

Local returning officers have the power to require a school to act as a polling venue and Pinner Park Primary School will, most likely, be required.

When schools are used as polling stations it is usual for the school to be closed to pupils on the day. This is because the polling station needs to be open to the public from 7am to 10pm, with access to toilets and running water. This compromises the controlled access systems.

Once we have some further details, and once we have made a decision about any school closure, we will inform you straight away. I know that you will understand that this is very much a 'live' news story and we will try to respond as quickly as possible. We thought that you would prefer to be forewarned, even though a final decision has not yet been made.

You may also wish to note that local elections are expected on Thursday 7 May 2020.
