

Benefit-Related Free School Meals





If your child is eligible for a benefit-related free school meal, we want to ensure that you do not miss out on this during the school closure.

We are teaming up with the major supermarkets to enable you to receive a weekly voucher - £11.50 per week per child (the money that we would usually spend on a free school meal for you). We hope that the following system will be as easy as possible for you. We are going to start this week and continue during term time for as long as the school is closed.

If your child is eligible for benefit-related free school meals, then you will receive a text and/or email. Look out for this!

When you receive the text message or email, simply:

- 1. Click on the link
- 2. Select your desired supermarket
- 3. A voucher is then shown which can be taken in-store or used online

Please note that this does not apply to all those children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 (who usually get a free meal) unless parents have registered due to receiving the qualifying benefits.

Keeping in Touch – New Email Addresses

Social Distancing and Isolation – New Measures

The single most important action we can all take, in fighting coronavirus, is to stay at home in order to protect the NHS and save lives.

When we reduce our day-to-day contact with other people, we will reduce the spread of the infection. That is why the government has now introduced three new measures, announced on Monday 23 March.

- 1. Requiring people to stay at home, except for very limited purposes
- 2. Closing non-essential shops and community spaces
- 3. Stopping all gatherings of more than two people in public



Every citizen must comply with these new measures. The relevant authorities, including the police, will be given the powers to enforce them – including through fines and dispersing gatherings.

These measures are effective immediately. The Government will look again at these measures in three weeks, and relax them if the evidence shows this is possible.

The Maths Factor

The Maths Factor is an online maths tutoring site for 4-11 year olds. The content is ordered to match the new 2014 national curriculum in England, but the site is used successfully by children all around the world.

The heart of The Maths Factor are short sessions designed for daily use. Each session starts with a lively video tutorial by Carol Vorderman, followed by a fun warm-up and then a practice. There are over 1,000 of these sessions, arranged into 32 topics.
