Benefit-Related Free School Meals





If your child is eligible for a benefit-related free school meal, we are sending vouchers for you to spend at local supermarkets.

In the first two weeks, we sent vouchers from a company called 'Wonde'. These will have been sent by email and text. These vouchers were for £11.50 per child.

Over Easter we moved to a national scheme set up by the Government using a company called Edenred. These vouchers were sent by email and were for £30 per child to cover the Easter holiday. This process was very problematic because the voucher scheme, and its website, were struggling to meet demand.

We are now moving back to use 'Wonde' because we don't want our families to have difficulty accessing the vouchers. We will place an order for the vouchers to cover a three week period - £45 per child – which will cover last week, this week and next week.

Aldi have now joined the scheme so we will contact you to check your supermarket preference. If we can't contact you, we'll stick with the supermarket you have previously selected.

We have had a few enquiries from parents whose children may be eligible for a benefit-related free school meal. We have sent the email and text to all those who are currently known to be eligible.

To find out whether your child qualifies for free school meals, and hence whether the school would receive additional funding, please fill in the details requested on the Free School Meals Eligibility
Checker. If you would prefer, we can check eligibility on your behalf. Please ask our school office team if you would like us to run the check for you.

A Certificate of Eligibility is available through <u>the website</u> for any child eligible for a free school meal that is attending a school in England. The Certificate of Eligibility should be shared with school.
