We also need to keep check of our own responses. There will be days when the whole world seems to be against us. However tough things seem, we don't want to transfer our anxieties, anger or frustrations onto our children.

During this difficult time, understanding our own emotions and those of our children is very important. Make sure you make time to relax and to reflect. These past few months have been challenging and we deserve a break!

## Wider Access to School - UPDATED

We can currently accommodate all our key-worker and vulnerable children on a full time basis, as we have done since the start of lockdown. We have two 'bubbles' set up, with a maximum of 15 children in each bubble. We have also invited all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 back to school on a part time basis.



Just 52% of schools were able to open more widely last week – we are pleased that our staff team have worked so hard to get more children into school.

#### Announcement by Gavin Williamson, Secretary of State for Education

The government had hoped to ask primary schools to open to all pupils for four weeks before the summer holidays. However, I am sure that you will have heard the news that this ambition, set out in the Government's coronavirus roadmap, will not possible.

With just half of all schools open to reception, year one and year six pupils last week, the Government has acknowledged that full opening of primaries this term would not be possible.

#### Pinner Park Actions

As a school leadership team, we receive the information at the same time as everyone else – we were listening intently to the statement to the House of Commons! Over the next couple of days, we will be discussing how this changes things for Pinner Park, and also liaising with other local schools. We will give our response as soon as we've had time to reflect on our current situation.

#### September 2020

The Education Secretary has said that the government will work to get children of all ages back to class by September. We do not yet know whether School will be fully open at that time or whether there will be restrictions on pupil numbers, year groups or activities. We have started to plan our staffing and curriculum but we await a clearer picture of what the Autumn term will hold.
