Classlist is completely free and it's easy to get started.

When you sign up with Classlist we will ask you to <u>register your child using his or her class for September</u> – then we'll be all ready to get started and we can invite our new Reception parents to join too.

Classlist is very much for parent-to-parent and PTA communication. As a school, we will continue to use our website, social media, email and SchoolPing for direct communication.

We will phase out the class WhatsApp groups because Classlist is a safer, more inclusive system for our PTA and also gives greater functionality for all parents. It will have all the features of the WhatsApp groups and much more. We're sure that you will love it!
