
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Continuing to be a 'Meet and Greet' school!

Parent and Teacher Consultations

The appointments are available after school during the final week of the half term.

In order to reduce the risk of Covid-19 transmission, these appointments will be held remotely, either through a telephone call or video link (Microsoft Teams). You will be able to choose which suits you best.

The information about booking an appointment has been sent through SchoolPing. Each class teacher has a schedule of availability and you can book a ten minute slot. We will need to keep strictly to time so that we can fit everyone in.

Using DB Primary



DB Primary is a cloud-based platform, which gives schools a safe and secure environment for staff and pupils to collaborate.

Because DB Primary is all web-based, children can access DB Primary anywhere with just a web browser and internet connection – there is nothing else they need to install on their computer.

Each child has an account for DB Primary – please let us know if you are not sure of your child's log-in details.

Each child will be a member of one or more 'communities'. There may be a class community, a year community, or some special interest communities (for example, 'Healthy Heroes'). We have also set up a Remote Learning community for each year group for children to access if they are required to self-isolate.

You can access all the communities your child is registered for by clicking on the 'communities' tab at the bottom left of the DB Primary home page (as indicated by the red arrow in the screenshot below).



Hand Sanitiser - Children in Years 3 - 6

Some parents have asked if children can bring their own hand sanitiser to use in school. This is because they prefer a particular brand, or because a particular type suits their child's skin.


We have reviewed this and, from next week, we will permit children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to bring in a small hand sanitiser if you wish. This will be kept in their personal 'zippy bag' and will be used when the teacher advises the children they should sanitise. We won't allow sanitiser to be kept in pockets or bags.

Please ensure that your child' sanitiser is <u>clearly named</u>. We won't allow children to share.

We will, of course, continue to provide hand sanitiser to all children – in the class and at all the main entrances to school.

Staff Spotlight



We have a large staff team, and many of our members of staff work behind the scenes – vital to the school, but often unseen.

This week, we want to highlight Mrs Sachania, our learning mentor.

Mrs Sachania is not based in a particular class – she works throughout the school. Her work is very varied – you'll find her in the hall first thing in the morning, often outside at playtimes and lunchtimes, or around the school during the school day.

As a learning mentor, Mrs Sachania works alongside individuals or groups of children. The role is as varied as the children in our school! For some children, Mrs Sachania is able to talk with them, discuss their learning, identify any barriers to learning and make a difference. For others, it may be a specific intervention to support their well-being and learning. For others it might be working as part of a group to support social interaction skills. And much more!

Speaking to your child's teacher



We know that it is difficult for parents to speak with teachers at the moment. With our social distancing measures in place it is difficult to speak with them at the beginning and end of the school day. Nonetheless, if you have a quick message or question, your child's teacher will be pleased to talk with you at these times!

We do want to respond to any queries and questions so please do speak to your child's teacher or use these alternatives. You can use these for passing messages on, or for requesting a phonecall from your child's teacher.

- Leave a message at the outdoor 'Parent Info Point' on the Upper School playground (look for the green gazebo). This is our 'outdoor office' whilst we have limited access to the school building for visitors.
- Send an email to your child's year group email address (for non-urgent queries) or to the school office (for more urgent enquiries). You can also request a call back.

Please remember that the Year Group emails are responded to, on average, once per week so please speak to your child's teacher, visit the Parent Info Point, or email the school office for more urgent enquiries.

All About Play

Each class 'bubble' is currently allocated a 'zone' in which to play at playtime and lunchtime. These are regularly rotated so that children can enjoy different areas of the outdoor spaces through the term.

We have prepared a set of resources for each bubble to use at playtimes and lunchtimes. These are a mixture of 'loose parts', which can be used imaginatively by the children, and more traditional toys and games.

The equipment is limited to a single bubble but will be rotated through the term.

Covid-19 and seasonal coughs and colds

As children return to school and we move towards winter, we expect to see colds and other viral illnesses circulating. This year the Covid-19 infection is also expected to circulate.

You may have seen some debate about whether Covid-19 in children, particularly younger children, might cause symptoms other than the typical cough, fever and change in sense of taste and smell. I am writing to provide you with updated medical advice which I hope will help you decide when to keep your child away from school and when to request a test.

The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health has just issued very helpful advice. The College Doctors reviewed the scientific evidence from the UK and international studies and have concluded that:

Children with cold symptoms, in particular a runny nose or sore throat, who do not have a fever or cough or a change in their sense of taste and smell should, if otherwise well, be in school and should not be tested for Covid-19.

My colleagues in the NHS in NW London have developed a simple flow chart which is attached at the end of this letter.

Tests should therefore *only* be requested for children or adults who have:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

If you or your child need to self-isolate because someone in the household has symptoms or because you have been in contact with a positive case, please do **not** request a test unless you or your child develops symptoms. A negative test during self isolation **does not** mean you can cut short self isolation. This is because the incubation period of the virus (the time between becoming infected and developing symptoms) can be up to 14 days.

The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health also concluded that:

- children, particularly those of primary school age and younger, are less likely to become infected with coronavirus
- children generally have a much milder illness than adults
- children transmit the virus less easily than adults.
