

Covid19 Procedures

Introduction

The safety of our children, staff and parents and all those around us are our priority at this time. Until further notice we are implementing the following health and safety procedures.

General Precautions

- Ensure that children use the safest mode of transport to school, and observe guidelines and rules when using public transport
- Parents must escort children to breakfast club and sign them in
- Adults should observe social distancing when arriving at breakfast club or after school club
- Parents are welcome to use their own pens to sign children in
- Hand sanitiser and pens will be available for parents, if needed
- Children will be washing and sanitising their hands more frequently (on arrival and departure, before and after eating, after visiting the toilet etc)
- The after school club will close at 5.30pm to enable cleaning to take place
- In line with the Government guidelines, children will not be required to wear a face covering

Food and Drink

- Children will be provided with breakfast (breakfast club) or tea (after school club)
- The children will be provided with cleaned cutlery and crockery which will be thoroughly cleaned before and after use
- Menus will be adapted so that all meals can be served safely

Equipment

- All toys and equipment will be thoroughly cleaned at the end of each session
- Carpets and rugs will not be used – mats with a wipeable surface will be used as an alternative and sanitised after each session
- Each child will be provided with their own stationery set to be used during the session
- All tables, benches and equipment will be sanitised at the end of the session

Grouping the children

- The children will be grouped to reduce the number of contacts. Children in Reception – Year 2 will be grouped together, and children in Years 3 – 6 will be grouped together.

Unwell Children

- If a child falls unwell whilst at club, he or she will be isolated and parents will be contacted to collect as soon as possible.
- Staff will not be required to wear a face covering (though some may choose to do so) but will wear the appropriate personal protective equipment if a child is unwell
