

YEAR 1 WEEK 5 ENVIRONMENT	
Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily maths lesson from White Rose Maths. Working on Numbots - your child will have an individual login to access this. Play on Number Balance - play levels 1, 2 and 3. Make the scales equal by ensuring that both sides total the same value. Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. This game could support this. Look out of your window and count how many trees, flowers and birds you can see. What can you see the most of? What can you see the least of? Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the hour and half hour. Choose a number between 10 and 20. How many different ways can this number be partitioned? Use part, part, whole. Do bigger numbers have more ways they can be partitioned? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the information video about caring for the environment. Discuss with your child after. Watch Read a story that has a woodland in. e.g. Little Red Riding Hood, The Gruffalo, Stick man Write these words onto paper and read them out aloud: wood, plastic, fabric, and metal. Can you put the sound buttons on? Choose to read a book in a different environment e.g. under a tree, under the table, snuggled up on someone else's bed in your home. Listen to Newsround and discuss what has been happening in the world this week. What happy/good news did you hear? What new things have you found out?
Weekly Phonics/Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<p>Daily phonics lesson (new lessons are uploaded at 10.30am each day). Please try and do the daily lesson if possible.</p> <p>The packs that were sent home before school closed include lists of the phonic sounds and words the children learn to spell and read in Year 1. A copy is also on the school website.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phonics play Top Marks Spelling Spell the days of the week Practise spelling 3 tricky words Practise spelling 3 common exception words Spelling City 	<p>When children are completing writing tasks it is important that they have the phonic sound mats and tricky word lists available in order to use. Remember phonetic spelling is acceptable of any word that is not on the tricky word list. They also need to remember to use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write a 'thank you' letter to the people who collect your rubbish and recycling. What could you include in your letter? Can you think of any questions you could ask about recycling or where the rubbish goes? Can you label the plants or trees in your garden, in the house or out of the window? Write a weather report. Can you use any adjectives? Write a list of things in your home that can be recycled.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week: Environment

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the environment. Learning may focus on changes to different environments, the impact of humans on environments, climate change etc .

Create a chart to record the weather. Label the chart with days of the week and record the weather at different points in the day. Can you write down key words and take a photograph of the sky. Does it change in the week? This [link](#) may help.

Watch the weather report on T.V. How do they describe the weather? What do you notice about the map? Can you find Birmingham on the map? Have they got symbols when they are talking about the weather?

Weather reporter: Pick a day that you would like to present as a weather reporter. Can you create some symbols to use when you are talking about the weather? Can you talk about the weather in your local area and maybe compare to another place in the world? Maybe someone at home could video you doing your weather report.

Design your own weather symbol. Design your own weather symbol for when it's raining, sunny, cloudy, thunder and lightning or snowing.

What a load of rubbish! With your child look at the rubbish as a family you throw out. Do you help to recycle? How do you sort these into junk and into recycling? Look at the range of items and group them into different material groups. Talk to a family member about how certain groups are plastics and can also look and feel different to each other. Could you think of 1 thing that you and your family could do to improve the recycling that you do in your family? [Ideas](#)

Beat the clock- Can you sort items into the correct recycling and waste bins? [Play](#)

Switch it off: Ask your child to take a look at all the electrical devices in their house. Are they all plugged in? Do they need to be plugged in? How could they create a poster to place around the house to help remind people to switch it off once they have finished.

Save Electricity, Recycle Paper, Conserve water. What could you include on these? Where could you place these in the house? Can you talk to your family about the posters and how you could help the planet?

Listen to a [song](#) about things we can do to help to save the planet.

Write and draw! Ask your child to choose one thing they could do to help the environment in school. Get them to make a poster to encourage people to do it! Think about the classroom and also the school.

World Environment day- This year it will be on Friday June 5th. On this day people from all over the world will do something positive to help our planet. Ask your child what could they do? Lots of little things can make a big difference. What could they do to celebrate World Environment Day at school? Can they create a poster to display at school?



Commemoration of VE Day – Friday 8 May

This year marks the 75th anniversary of Victory in Europe, or VE, Day. The bank holiday has been moved to Friday 8 May to match the date of the first VE Day, so that the nation can commemorate this anniversary together.

We are proposing a 'Street Party at Home'. Street parties were a feature of the very first VE Day and have been a part of national commemorations ever since. We can't have a 'street party' this year, but we can create our very own 'Street Party at Home'.
