<ul style="list-style-type: none">We live on Earth. Have a look at a globe. That is what our world looks like from space. Where are we on Earth? Do you know people in different parts of the world? Where are they on the globe?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Listen to a space themed story: Roaring Rockets and Whatever Next?Sing <i>Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star</i>, <i>Zoom zoom zoom</i> and <i>5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer</i> together.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">Listen to the story of <i>Whatever Next</i> and retell the story. You could use things from around your home like Baby Bear.  <ul style="list-style-type: none">Look at the sky during the day (not at the sun) what can you see? Look the sky at night and compare what you can see. Speak in past and present tenses.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Practise putting on and taking off socks and shoes.

ORAL BLENDING

It is important children have plenty of experience of listening to adults modelling oral blending before they are introduced to letters.

The word 'cap' is segmented into 'c-a-p' said with letter sounds (not letter names) with a short pause between sounds. Then it is blended together to say the word 'cap'. Use only single syllable words for oral blending.

- Set out pencil colours or crayons. Give instructions to put away or colour with the colour you say with sounds:

r-e-d

bl-a-ck

p-i-nk

b-l-ue

br-ow-n

p-ur-ple

gr-ee-n

wh-i-te

or-an-ge

ye-ll-ow

- Give instructions with the last word said with sounds: *It's time to get your c-oa-t.*
You can also play this as a game: *touch your t-oe-s; tap your h-ea-d.*
- Emma the Explorer (or your child's name) has a list of things she needs to take on her adventure to the moon with Baby Bear. Can you help?
Sound out words below and blend the sounds together to find out what to take. You could pack a bag or draw pictures.

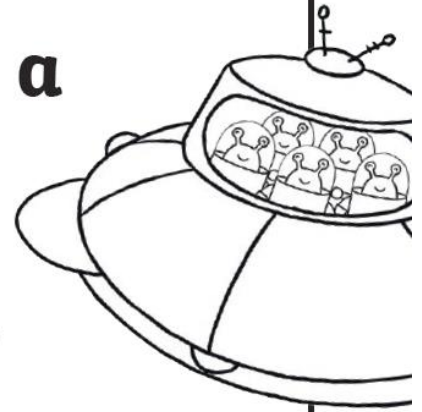

Cardboard Tube Rocket

You will need:

Long cardboard tube
Silver foil
Tissue paper
Brightly coloured card
Brightly coloured paint
PVA glue
Scissors
Sticky tape



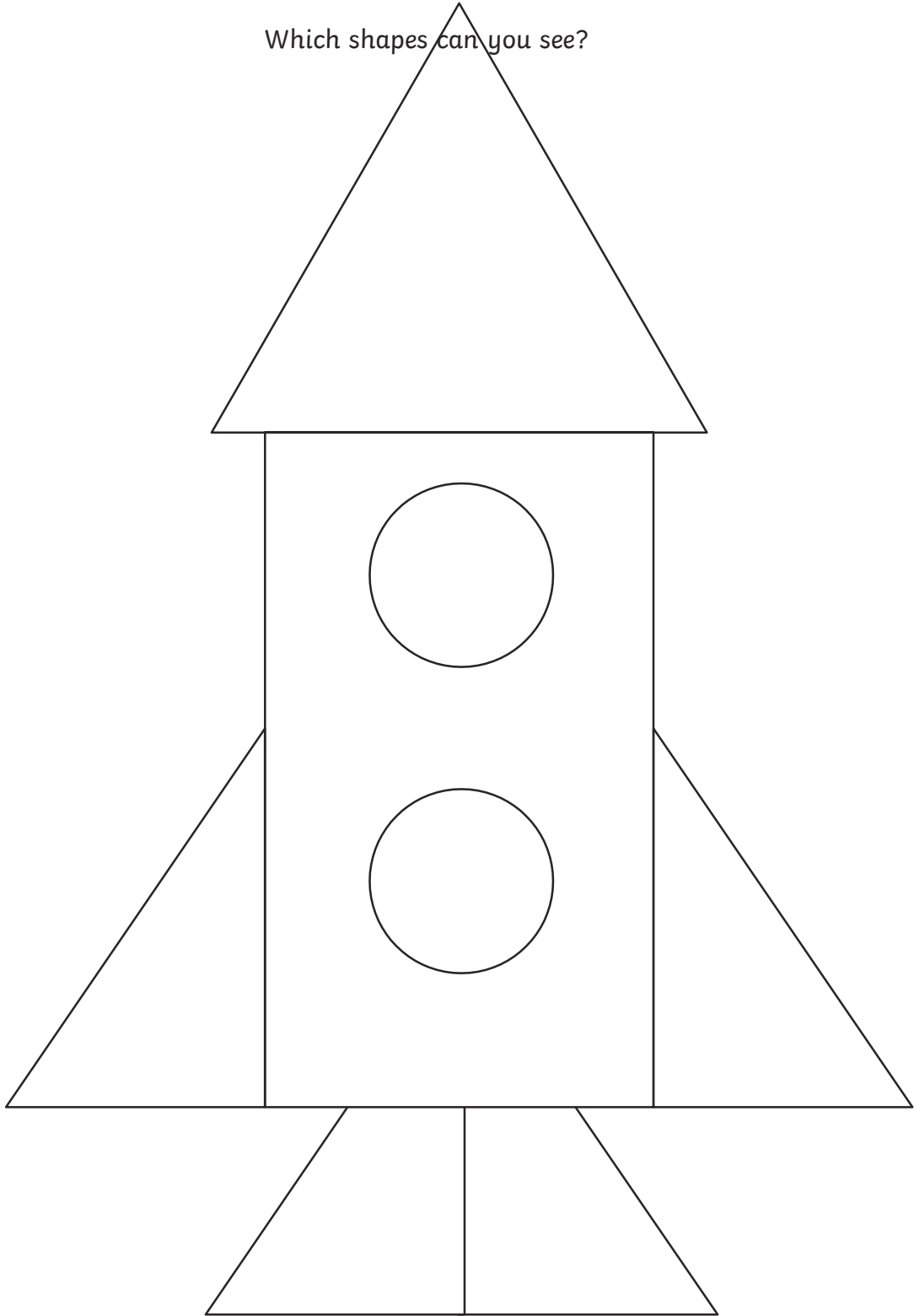
Instructions

1. First paint the cardboard tube in a bright colour, then leave to dry.
2. For the top of the rocket, choose a different coloured card. Then draw around a small circular object, such as a cup, onto this.
3. Cut out the circle. Then also cut out a line going from the outside to the centre of the circle, stopping once you reach the middle.
4. Roll the circle into a cone shape, then secure using sticky tape.
5. Stick two pieces of tape on the inside of the cone. Then stick the cone onto the top of the cardboard tube.
6. Now make some windows for the rocket using silver foil. To do this, draw around a small circular object onto the foil three times.
7. Next cut out the circles in silver foil and stick them onto the rocket using PVA glue.
8. For the flame, take some pieces of tissue paper and place them onto of each other in layers.

9. Pick up the layers of tissue paper and cut the strips vertically into them, ensuring the cuts do not go right to the top.
10. Finally, gather the sheets of tissue paper at the top, then secure and strengthen this by sticking tape around it.
11. Using sticky tape to attach the flame to the bottom of the rocket.

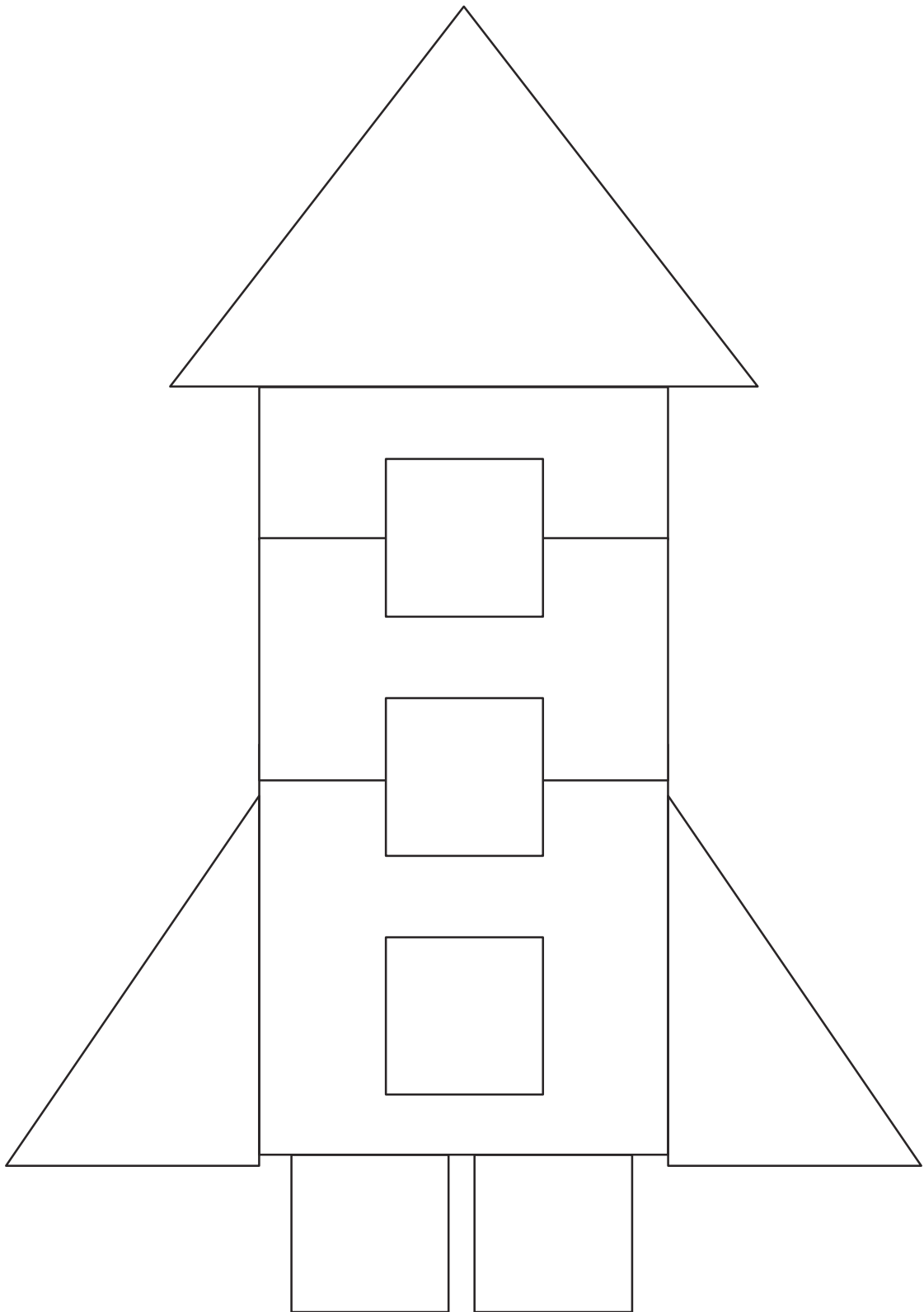
