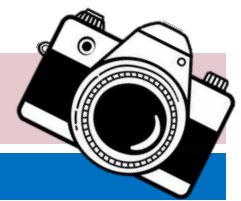

However, they may use some of their geographic skills in other areas of their learning, such as looking at maps.</p>	<p>During this term, children will explore how travel and modes of transport have changed throughout the centuries. They will be looking at the technological changes that have influenced transportation.</p>	<p>Children in Key Stage 1 are not required to learn an additional language as we focus on them developing their skills in English.</p>
