English

Phonics / Spelling

- Continuing progress through the phonics stages

Grammar and Punctuation

- Verbs (including adding -ing and -ed)

Writing

Maths

Number – Place Value:

- Count within, and use a number line to 20
- Understand numbers between 10 and 20
- One more / one less
- Compare and order numbers to 20

Addition and Subtraction

- Add by counting on within 20
- Find, make and use number bonds to 20
- Doubles and near doubles
- Subtraction – counting back and finding the difference
- Explore calculation related to known facts
- Missing number problems

Art & Design

Children will be exploring the basics of colour theory and will learn about how mixing primary colours can make other colours. They will be appreciating the way that the artist Mondrian used primary colours.



Computing

Children will be creating, editing and manipulating digital text, which can be stored to create their very own eBook.
E-safety – knowing what information is safe to share online.



Design & Technology

Children will focus on an art and design theme this half term before moving onto a design and technology project next half term.

Geography

Children will be learning about natural and man-made features in the landscape around them and will be thinking about the different types of weather that people experience around the world.



History

Children will focus on a geography topic this half term before moving on to a geography topic next half term.

Languages

Children in Key Stage 1 are not required to learn an additional language as we focus on them developing their skills in English.

Music

Children will be exploring patterns that appear in music. They will use a mixture of voice and percussion instruments to copy, echo and create musical patterns. They will listen out for patterns in pieces of music that they hear.

PE & Sport

Indoors, children will explore travelling actions, movement skills and balancing in dance working individually and with a partner to create ideas in relation to the theme. Outside, children will develop the basic skills required in invasion games
