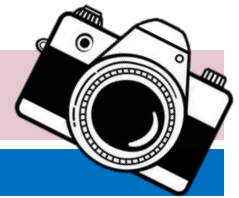


Curriculum Snapshot



Summer (1) Term 2023

English

Phonics / Spelling

- Using the suffixes **-ful** and **-ness**.

Grammar and Punctuation

- Adding the suffix **-es** and **-ed** to verbs
- Adding the prefix **un-**
- Apostrophes (including for contractions)
- Exclamation marks and question marks

Writing

- Letters and postcards, character descriptions, retelling, instructions and non-chronological reports

Chosen Texts

- Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers
- Yeti and the Bird by Nadia Shireen

Maths

Multiplication and Division

- Counting in 2s 10s and 5
- Recognise and add equal groups
- Make arrays, doubles and equal groups

Fraction

- Recognise half of an object or shape
- Recognise a quarter of an object or shape
- Find a half and a quarter of a quantity

Position and Direction

- Describe turns
- Describe positions: left, right, forwards, backwards, above and below.
- Ordinal numbers

Art & Design

During this half term, children will look at the work of Vincent Van Gogh to develop their understanding of colour and tone and to explore how different brushstrokes can be used to create different effects.



Computing

iModel

In this unit children explore how computer models work and understand they can be used to represent real or imaginary environments, situations and scenarios.

E-safety – comparing and contrasting online and offline bullying.



Design & Technology

Throughout this term, children will be exploring basic mechanisms and how products are designed using simple levers and sliders. They will use the design process to create their own mechanisms.



Geography

Children will focus on a history topic this half term in which they may use geographical skills such as map reading. They will be moving on to a geography topic next half term.

History

Children will take a journey back through the ages, learning why castles were built. They will be exploring what life was like for the different groups of people living in castles and understanding how castles were defended.



Languages

Children in Key Stage 1 are not required to learn an additional language as we focus on them developing their skills in English.

Music

Music can be used to tell stories. This term, children will explore how their favourite stories can be set to music and how composers use different musical techniques to bring a story to life.

PE & Sport

Inside, children will learn net and wall games, develop throwing, catching and racket skills, learning to track and hit a ball. Outside, athletic skills such as running at different speeds, changing direction, jumping and throwing will be developed.

Is Shabbat important to Jewish children?

Science
