Summer (2) Term

English

Phonics / Spelling

- Adding the suffixes –ness –er
- Words ending in –il
- Words with **ar** or **or** after **w**

Grammar and Punctuation

- Subordination and coordinations
- Expanded noun phrases
- Statements, questions exclamations or commands
- Use of capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks and commas to separate items in lists

Statistics

Art & Design

During this half term, children will compare and contrast different artistic styles by looking at the works of Matisse, Seurat and Delaunay. They will experiment with mark making and will form their own opinions about art.



Computing

Children will explore coding and computational thinking practices using technology as a tool for creativity, expression and learning with Scratch Jr.

E-safety – thinking about how passwords keep us and our information safe.

Design & Technology

Throughout this term children will be linking to their learning about keeping healthy by exploring different fruits and vegetables and how to prepare them in different ways to create a smoothie drink.

Geography

Children will focus on a history topic this half term in which they may use geographical skills such as map reading.

History

Children will be learning about the golden age of exploration and discovery, focusing on a number of well-known explorers, including Ibn Battuta, spanning over 800 years of brave explores on land, the sea, in the air and in space.



Languages

Children in Key Stage 1 are not required to learn an additional language as we focus on them developing their skills in English.

Music

This half term the children will draw together their experiences with African music throughout the year by exploring some traditional African call and response songs.

PE & Sport

Indoors, children will enjoy team-building games, leading a partner whilst considering safety, having the opportunity to show honesty and fair play. Outside, striking and fielding, developing skills of throwing, catching, tracking and retrieving a ball.
