English

Phonics / Spelling

- Consolidating and securing phonics learning from Early Years and Year 1.
- **Grammar and Punctuation**
- Expanded noun phrases

Measurement – Length and Mass

- Estimate and measure length, height and mass using rulers and scales
- Compare and order length using $<$ $>$ $=$

Statistics – Graphs:

- Interpret and construct pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and tables
- Ask and answer simple questions about graphs

Developing Calculation Skills:

- Recall and use \times & \div facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Solve problems involving \times & \div using different approaches
- Show that \times is commutative and that \div is not

Children will begin to explore how they can combine shape and colour to create representations using the work of Tanielle Childers as inspiration.



Computing

iPublish - Children become publishers and will use computer software to create their very own eBooks.

E-safety – forming safe online relationships



Design & Technology

Children will be investigating, designing and constructing a product which include wheels and levers and therefore has movement. They will look at different vehicles for their ideas.

Geography

Children will focus on a history topic this half term in which they may use geographical skills such as map reading. They will be moving onto a geography topic next half term.

History

Children will learn about a group of influential and inspirational women who risked their lives to help others during dangerous times in dangerous part of the world – our nurturing nurses.



Languages

Children in Key Stage 1 are not required to learn an additional language as we focus on them developing their skills in English.
