English

Spelling

Design & Technology

Linked to their learning in science about food, nutrition children will plan and prepare a healthy sandwich having explored a range of ingredients they can use to make them both healthy and tasty.



Geography

Children will focus on a history topic this half term in which they may use geographical skills such as map reading. They will be moving on to a geography topic next half term.

History

This half term the children will be travelling back in time thousands of years to learn about prehistoric Britain learning first about the Stone Age before moving on through history to the Bronze Age and Iron Age.



Languages

Children will continue to develop some of the key basic vocabulary in French with a focus on different animals they might find in the wild, on a farm or in a zoo.

Music

Children will explore how, in different cultures all around the world, music plays an important part in people's celebrations. They will focus on rhythm and developing their confidence to perform in front of an audience.

PE & Sport

During their indoor PE sessions, children will explore different activities to enhance and promote their physical and mental fitness. Outside, children will begin to develop tackling and invasion skills through tag rugby.
