English

Spelling

- Words ending with the /g/ sound spelt –gue and the /k/ sound spelt –que
- Adding suffixes beginning with vowels to polysyllabic words
- Homophones

Grammar and Punctuation

- Using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and place; use of inverted comma and other punctuation to indicate direct speech; use of commas after fronted adverbials; expanded noun phrases; use of paragraphs to organise ideas.

Children will think in 3D during this unit as they explore how they can manipulate and construct using clay, to create a tile taking inspiration from Roman designs they have explored in their history unit.

Children will continue to develop their skills of computer coding building on the basics they have already learnt.

Design & Technology

Children will explore how to design and construct robust and practical shell structures which meet a specific design need. They will develop various design skills including accurate measuring and cutting.

Geography

Children will focus on a history topic this half term in which they may use geographical skills such as map reading. They will be moving on to a geography topic next half term.

This half term the children will continue their learning about the Romans in Britain. They will be learning about the legacy that the Roman Empire left behind them in Britain and they will be learning about the decline of the Roman Empire.
