### English

#### Spelling

### Art & Design

During this half term, children will explore the work of the artist Georgia O’Keeffe, critically evaluating her work and recreating some of the effects she used with paint and different tools.



### Computing

Throughout this unit children will continue to develop computational thinking and will focus on programming animations with Scratch

### Design & Technology

Throughout this term children will be exploring textile design. They will be looking at how they can combine and join different fabric shapes to make a useful product. Their designs will be based on examples they have evaluated.

### Geography

Children will be looking a aspects of physical geography this half term with a particular focus on mountains and rivers. They will understand the physical processes linked to mountains and rivers and consider their impact on people.



### History

Children will focus on a geography topic this half term before moving on to a history topic next half term. During their geography unit they may think about how a place has changed over time and what the reasons for the change might be.

### Languages

This half term, children will hear and learn the vocabulary they need to talk about the names of the seasons, seasonal activities and the date and when their birthday is.

### Music

Using elements of pop music that children are familiar with, children will think about composing and performing their own pop hits, that are made up of several parts, using a range of tuned and untuned instruments.

### PE & Sport

During indoor sessions children will develop their competencies in racket skills when playing Tennis. Outside, children develop teamwork skills through completion of a number of outdoor, adventurous challenges.
